

Camping at TSC

We have ample room for tents, trailers and motor homes. Power and water hookups are limited – please contact derekmackie@yahoo.ca for options. A long extension cord should suffice for most light power needs. There is a shower and toilet on site that we reserve for the Ladies during the contest. Port-a-potties and the Bunda Bath (camp shower) are available for the Gentlemen during the Contest. We will have a charging station set up for batteries and phones, etc. No grey/black water dumps. The clubhouse has a beer fridge and kitchen, which you are welcome to use. Our water is potable.

Food

There are restaurants within 15 minutes' drive in most directions. Mount Forest has lots of options, Shelburne some options and Orangeville the most options.

The closest Tim Horton's is at the intersection of Hwy89 and Hwy6. (About 12 minutes in a caffeine-panic drive. *Caution!* There is often a speed trap as you enter town in the reduced speed area.)

Each of the previously-mentioned towns has grocery stores, as well as Dundalk. Conn, just a few minutes away on Hwy 89 has a corner store with the basics, but limited hours. (Northwest corner of the intersection.)
